



Mayor's Mayor's Property of the Control of the Cont



The news recently has been a lot about the future of St. Louis City and St. Louis County. The lack of economic growth is a problem. What is the best method to go about solving this problem?

One answer was there are too many independent governments in St. Louis County, i.e. municipals. This was the conclusion of a privately funded organization (Better Together). Located in St. Louis, they built a staff to study the operations of the County and the County Cities. Their stated objection was to use these studies for comparison to other larger consolidated metropolis. Thus gaining insight on how others are (or are attempting) to solve this problem. This movement started threeplus years ago. There have been citizen meetings, politician meetings, Missouri Legislature passing laws to regulate more City activities.

This is not to say this effort is the only one underway to address the economic growth. Nor am I, in this article, going to share my assessment of the value of this approach - for it is what it is. After the Ferguson happening, the focus became to prove a merger of the City of St. Louis with the County into one would enhance our economic growth. Better Together hired lobbyists in Jeff City to get legislators involved. This movement continues. For

example, the Missouri Legislature passed in 2015 a law limiting the amount of Municipal Revenues a City could collect from court fines (mostly traffic). The law reduced from 20% to 12.5% the annual fines revenue for St. Louis County Cities only.

As I discussed in a previous Mayor's Corner, our City was not affected as our amounts tend to run at 12% or less. Why would the State Legislature pass an arbitrary percentage with no information about why fines are what they are. A group of St. Louis County Cities challenged the new law and in May of this year, the Missouri Supreme Court upheld a lower court decision invalidating the law. It's important you are aware there are efforts to consolidate and/or eliminate small cities. One generally accepted rule of government is government closest to the people is the more effective government. How do you feel about it?

Having said that, your City Council and your Mayor are elected to serve based on your direction. Certainly, our region, as do all of us, face problems, present and in the future. My challenge to you is be informed as this scenario develops, call me and/or your alderperson for information and to express your opinion. My telephone number is **636-394-8916.**





She liked to win and tease her sister, just like you do.





INSTRUCTIONS

- 1.) In saucepan mix water and sugar. Bring to boil, making sure sugar is dissolved.
- 2.) Turn off heat and add basil leaves to syrup and muddle.
- 3.) Set aside and let it cool.
- 4.) While it's cooling, place freshly squeezed lime juice and vodka in a freezable container.
- 5.) Strain syrup and add to lime/vodka mixture.
- 6.) Mix well and place in freezer.

It'll be ready to drink in a few hours. Pour into a martini glass and garnish with a lime slice and a basil leaf and enjoy!

Residents Tom Hartnagel & Eric Verhulst Share Their Passion For Volunteering At ANGELS' ARMS

Close your eyes. Now, imagine your family and the role that you play in your household. For most of us, this is easy. But for

some children, the image is not as clear. Children in foster homes do not always know how a family works, or even what it means to be a part of one. Angels' Arms gives these children the chance to learn what it means to have a role in their new family.

Due to her years serving as a foster parent, founder Bess Wilfong recognized how much responsibility the job comes with and saw how things could be better. After frequently receiving calls to foster sibling groups, Wilfong hatched an idea for a place in St. Louis that could keep sibling groups whole where they could grow together in a loving home. Clarkson Valley resident Tom Hartnagel has been a part of this organization from the start. Along with playing a part in its founding, Hartnagel is a board member and his key role as chairmen for their fall event helps raise about a fourth of their revenue.

Since its founding in 2000, Angels' Arms has cared for over 400 children, transforming their lives so that they may live up to their potential. They provide support for the children by giving them all the resources that they may need, like clothing, school supplies, support for proms or homecomings, and other activities such as sports camps or music lessons. Currently, there are 12 homes around St. Louis, including the areas of Ballwin, North County, South County, O'Fallon, and the city of St. Louis. At these homes, the children experience daily chores, homework, activities, family meals, and sharing.







Through the work of fundraisers, Angels' Arms is able to give their foster children the chance to be children. As they do not receive state funding, the organization relies heavily on soliciting their own funds. Events include trivia nights, which support outings for the children once a month, and birthdays. The junior board, whose goal is to support the mission, are in charge of two large events- a Sip and Savor in the spring and the fall Bar Bounce. However, Angels' Arms biggest event of the year, a dinner function at the River City Hotel and Casino, falls in November. Many volunteers, including Clarkson Valley resident Eric Verhulst, a member of the Board of Directors, make these events possible, as they are the backbone of the programs.






