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

2015 is rapidly coming to a close. I hope it has been a successful year for you and your family. Just looking back to remember the good times can be fun. As I began to look back on the City's year to answer, "How are we doing?" - I realized the question begs, "Against what?" I had an uncle who when asked, "How you doing?" he would answer, "Compared to what?" All this took me back to why Clarkson Valley exists. A successful community's sustainability has roots in understanding and appreciating where it comes from. Let me share a bit of history:

Clarkson Valley was originally incorporated in 1950 as a village comprising approximately 1708 acres. I believe that they had a vision for this new community — a vision for an environment of maintaining the natural beauty of the area, trees, wildlife, residential homes on spacious lots, etc. — thus the requirement of a minimum one-acre lots. Between original incorporation and 1985, it perfected four annexations. As a result of these annexations, the size of the City has grown to 1825 acres. In 1988, the village elected to become a fourth class city. The City is bounded by Wildwood on the west; the City of Chesterfield on the north, west and east; Ballwin on the east; and Ellisville on the south. The real estate assessed valuation has grown from \$8.56 million in 1978 to \$104.6 million in 2015. The City's population in 1973 was estimated to be 164. The population of the City was 2632 in the 2010 census.

The current government structure of the City is as prescribed for a fourth class city by Missouri State law. The Board of Aldermen is comprised of six alderpersons, two from each of three wards elected to alternating two-year terms. A Mayor is elected at-large every four years. The Aldermanic meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month in facilities (leased) at the Clarkson Executive Center at 15933 Clayton Road. The City maintains an office in the same building.

We define our mission as:

The mission of the City of Clarkson Valley is to maintain and enhance a secure environment that ensures quality of life, protection of both personal safety and property value with costeffective city government.

Implicit in the City's mission is the preservation and enhancement of our existing neighborhoods, therefore, you and your neighbors are the focus for how we proceed. For it's your and my neighborhoods that identify who we are and their condition is a major determinant of the desirability of Clarkson Valley as a place to raise a family. So how does this translate into action by the City? Enforcement of ordinances passed based on our mission, i.e. trash pickup, providing police protection, land usage and building code requirements is critical. Your thoughts, ideas, and opinions of how things are going is important. So let us know what you like or dislike. Call or e-mail (contact information is on the website).





It is wonderful to meet all of you and hear your stories. There are so many yet to tell, but being a part of your lives brings us great joy, and we are grateful to have earned your support and trust. As a reminder, this publication is private to Clarkson Valley. We work hard to make sure that this newsletter is a safe place to share pictures and stories of your families. We feel that there are many more great things to come for *Clarkson Valley Living*, and we cannot wait to bring them to you!

We also want to thank all the business partners who have supported the publication these many months. These business owners only ask that you give them a chance to earn your trust and business. Being a part of your community is very important to them, and they are committed to offering you the best service possible.

We encourage you to keep your ideas and articles coming. We love St. Louis and all of the history and traditions here, and we love our subdivision and all of our fun neighbors and neighborhood traditions! We love to veg out on the beach with extended



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



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his month, Tracy and Lee Allen shared their beautiful home with us. They have lived in this home for three years and recently completed remodeling the entire house and property to make it feel like home.

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

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
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It's one day a year – why not overindulge and hit the gym later? You have waited 365 days for turkey with stuffing and an extra helping of that succulent sweet potato casserole. But wait – you're on a diet. What are you to do?

CREATE A CALORIE DEFICIT. Even if it is Thanksgiving, it is important for your fitness routine not to fall by the wayside. Create a calorie deficit with heart-pumping cardio and even resistance training. The American Council on Exercise encourages gymgoers to stick to a moderate-intensity aerobic workout before a big meal. Why is that? You don't want to deplete your storage of glycogen, causing you to feast upon food as if you are famished! By taking it easy at the gym, you can utilize body fat as fuel (sparing your reserve of glycogen). In turn, you will feel energized but not starving. If you want to lift weights, don't go heavy. Choose longer rest periods between sets with light to moderate weights.

HAVE A SNACK BEFOREHAND. Yes, you read that right. Even if you are an avid calorie counter, a snack before Thanksgiving dinner can actually save you calories in the end. Go for a satiating snack, such as almonds and top it off with water. Almonds are known for promoting fullness. By feeling satisfied before the big meal, you will consume less calories. Keep in mind that almonds are full of monounsaturated fats (MUFA), as well as fiber. MUFAs benefit your health. In a study in the *International Journal of Obesity*, participants who supplemented almonds to their low calorie diet over 24 weeks lost 62 percent more weight than those who supplemented with complex carbohydrates. Not nuts over nuts? Go for olive oil and bread. Even two teaspoons of olive oil on bread can also cut cravings when eaten 20 minutes before a meal.

BETHE MAN (OR WOMAN) WITH A PLAN. Come armed and dangerous to the Thanksgiving buffet with a plan. Don't be afraid to use a smaller plate. By doing so, you will choose less and eat less. Think about your food choices. Pack on the protein (say yes to the turkey or ham) and slow down on the refined carbohydrates, starches and empty calories. Don't forget the veggies either; these fiber-filled vegetables pack a punch. Dark leafy greens are teeming with Vitamin A, C, K, as well as folate and iron. Opt for water or tea instead of the alcohol and save your valuable calories for the pumpkin pie, which is packed with beta carotene. During eating, put your fork down between bites. Finally focus on your family. Engage in meaningful conversation. After all, family is what Thanksgiving is all about!

WHAT IF I OVERINDULGE? What if the mashed potatoes get the best of you or the apple cobbler was too tempting to pass up? Burn off those extra calories by walking around the mall on Black Friday. Or make the treadmill your friend as you work off those calories once again. Happy Thanksgiving!
