It has a wealth of information from the routine to the often forgotten needs. An example from the Promote Preparedness in 2017 page:

 Make a family emergency communication plan and include your pets.

- Identify an out of town emergency contact to coordinate information with family/friends.
- · Check on neighbors.
- Keep an emergency kit wherever you spend time: home, car, work etc.
- Download the FEMA App and set up local alerts.
- Listen to local officials by radio, TV or social media and take action.
- Practice your preparedness plans with a drill or exercise.
- Take a first aid class so you can help until first responders arrive.

This is just a general list.

The site gets more specific,
i.e. reminding you of things

like What supplies go in your Disaster Supplies Kit, plans for winter extreme cold, fire safety and power outages. Example, look back at last year's Christmas decorations. Did you handle them in the safest manner, i.e. putting up and removing them to a storage place? This site will help remind you. Publications for the various emergencies can be ordered, including subjects such as Family Emergency Plan, Emergency Supply List, General Brochure, Pet Owners, Seniors, People with Disabilities, Computer Emergency Plan & Ready, Kids Publications to name a few. So the question is, do you have an emergency plan and/ or is it up to date?





Meet Terrie Desloge, resident of Clarkson Valley. She is making a difference for families with special needs children. Terrie and her husband, Tom, have three children, two sons and one daughter. Her daughter, Faith, 11, was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at eight months from an in-utero brain injury. Terrie volunteers in many capacities but because of her daughter's disability, she has been driven to help Faith and other children with disabilities.

She has recently developed and founded Missouri's first sensory and motor rooms called Play Differently, using state of the art Snoezelen equipment for children ages four to 12. Terrie spent years interviewing therapists and parents to collect data to make Play Differently a place that not only is calming for special needs children but therapeutic, as well. Her dream became a reality on October 16, 2016, with an open house and ribbon-cutting ceremony, allowing the community to get first-hand experience with the equipment. Initial funding for Play Differently was provided by Hand of Hope, which is part of Joyce Meyer ministries and outside donations are always welcome.

There are two rooms at Play Differently, the sensory room and the motor room. The sensory room is in a controlled environment in which sights, sounds and touch are monitored to produce a calming effect on each child. The equipment gives each child the multi-sensory feedback that provides sensory regulation. The rooms' purpose is to allow special needs parents to have a respite while their children play with a purpose in a therapeutic environment. For these children, time spent in the sensory rooms increase their focus and concentration while improving mobilization, social relations and communication. Each participant will engage in cause-and-effect activities, as well as experiencing optical and acoustic interactions.

The visual/auditory area in the sensory room generates a relaxing effect but also activates different perception aimed at basal stimulation for those neurologically impaired. The room emphasizes low, rhythmical, soft, quiet tones or white noise, white or pastel colors with minimal contrast, decreased light in predictable patterns and it engages a child's ability to track objects. The motor room activities include swinging, jumping and rocking. These activities have a powerful impact on the brain's ability to process information. This vestibular input is one of the core elements of sensory integration therapy. The linear movement activities in this room will help improve speech, language, balance, auditory processing and more.

Presently, space currently allows six children to play with a purpose with a 2:6 ratio. The capacity is set at 12 and the goal is to have a 1:1 ratio. Play Differently is staffed with one special education teacher and one assistant. Terrie's goal is that the assistant would be a student/intern of occupational, speech, development











or physical therapy. Future plans include increasing staff to offer Saturday morning respite care, increase staff to offer Friday parent night out, increase capacity to 30 children ages four to 12 and develop a sensory room for ages 13-18. Future plans are to expand to other churches to reach out to other communities.

Play Differently is now open Sundays from 9:45 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. and on the first Friday of every month from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.





# Bill's Darn Good

That's better than a box of chocolate?...Bill's Darn Good Cof-**V** fee Cake! This coffee cake recipe has been in Bill Howard's (Dunhill resident) family forever! Actually, we are not really sure who it originally came from, so Bill just named it after himself! Copyright infringement?...perhaps! When we make this, it lasts for about an hour, maybe less. When our family gives it as a "gift," we are always asked for the recipe so here it is!

### **INGREDIENTS**

Batter:

1 box yellow cake mix

34 cup water

½ cup oil

1 tsp. vanilla

1/4 tsp. vanilla flavored extract

4 eggs

1 box vanilla pudding mix

Sugar Mixture:

½ cup sugar

2 tsp. cinnamon

½ cup pecan pieces

Topping:

1 cup powdered sugar

1/8 tsp. butter extract

3 Tbsp. milk

### **DIRECTIONS**

Grease (or Pam) and flour 2 loaf pans or 3 small bundt pans. Sprinkle part of sugar mixture on bottom of each pan before putting in batter. After pouring batter in pan, put remaining sugar mixture on top and swirl into batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-60. (You should check it starting at 40 minutes and keep an eye on it...each oven is different!) As soon as you press on the top of the cake and springs back it is ready to take out. Immediately dribble topping over the cake while still in the pan.

Let it cool in the pan, and then eat and enjoy!



# Meet Voluntee *Anna Grace Yuska*

ANNA GRACE YUSKA is a sophomore at MICDS and lives in Forest Hills with her dad, Gregor, her mom, Ellie, her brother, Henry, and her two dogs, Ringo and Wilbur. She donates three hours of her time every Sunday to the Gateway: 61 Church Play Differently program which serves as a daycare for kids with neurological and physical disabilities ranging from autism to cerebral palsy. Professional special education teachers and teenage teaching assistants play with kids between the ages of six and twelve in two very special rooms: the motor room and the sensory room.

Every Sunday morning, the kids first go to the motor room which is filled with fun toys and activities such as swings, slides, trampolines, rollers and fun house mirrors where kids can get their energy out and fine-tune their motor skills. Then comes snack





where they can practice their verbal and conversational skills with others kids while eating. Next, everyone colors pictures which brings out the kids' creativity, along with helping them focus and practicing holding the drawing tools correctly. The sensory room is next which provides a soothing space for the kids to settle down and relax. This room is filled with soothing lights and projectors where the kids can choose what kind of theme or color they want for the room that day. They can fill the room with nature, colors, numbers and letters, cities, etc. There's also a water feature tube that bubbles and changes colors and a curtain of strings that light up per the theme of the room. This room is very relaxing and the kids often fall asleep as they can snuggle into fuzzy carpets, beanbags and weighted blankets. After a rest, they work with play dough and other toys. The kids communicate with each other, some asking how school is going or how another is feeling. Finally, everyone goes back to the motor room to get all their wiggles out before their parents come to pick them up.

Anna Grace finds this job very fulfilling, and spending time with the kids leaves her with a feel-good attitude while knowing she is making a difference in her community and the greater world. This playroom program is the first of its kind in the State of Missouri, and she hopes that **Play Differently** will grow and develop to offer fun daycares to as many special-needs kids as possible because they all deserve the kind of attention and support they get every week at **Play Differently**.


