




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

ALL ABOUT CITY TAXES

With 2017 being a year for Real Estate reassessment, you should have received your new property assessment. So, I thought a review of what, how, why, how much you pay your City would be appro-

priate. Cities exist by state law to provide services desired by its' citizens not appropriate at the state/federal levels. Where does the money to provide City services (fiscal year 2016-2017 calls for expenses of \$886,591) come from? The detailed 2016-17 budget can be found on our web page www.clarksonvalley.org.

A look at the primary revenue sources show: County sales tax (44%); Real Estate (14%); Utilities/franchise (13%); Traffic fines (11%); State gasoline (8%). The formulas used to calculate the amount to be distributed to us are established either by state statues or by a previous citizen vote.

Let's look at Real Estate. Your tax is composed of many governmental entities (be sure to take a detailed look at your statement): Rockwood School District, Fire District, Metropolitan Zoo, County services, etc. and Clarkson Valley. The residential real estate rate for Clarkson Valley is \$0.129 per \$100 assessed valuation. For a home assessed at \$500,000 located in Clarkson Valley, the tax would be \$122.55. I looked at cities around us - an example Chesterfield. For the same home assessment in Chesterfield, the tax would be \$57 a year - a difference of \$65.55 more.

But what about other City taxes? Percentage of your bill added to your total bill:

As you can see, the total percentage applicable to Clarkson Valley is considerable less - you pay less. This is as it should be. Chesterfield and the other municipalities shown above have maintenance requirements for streets, buildings, etc. Clarkson Valley owns nothing, i.e. no streets to repair, no buildings to maintain, etc. This means you and your neighbor can decide about your street. Your reassessment statement that you received has an estimated tax bill giving you the opportunity to review before the rates are finalized.

If you don't like what you see, you have the opportunity to voice your concerns and/or objections to the appropriate organization. If you feel your assessment is not correct, the Board of Equalization will hear your appeal before July 10.

What about what we spend? Here's a brief look at 2016-17 budget expenses. Of the \$886,591, \$430,702 was for police (48%); sanitation \$123,255 (14%). These two make up 62% of all expenses. This is as it should be, two of the basic services the City provides. Looking forward to next year's budget, the Council has authorized a Police Contract with the City of Chesterfield reducing our expenses from \$430,702 to \$407,107 - a contract effective July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2022. This immediate saving of \$23,595 in year one will provide us with protection from increases for the next

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


This is a freshly-planted flower box by Judy Emmendor. The plant in center that has not yet bloomed is a full-sun impatien called SunPatiens.

What's one way you think the world will be different when you're my age?


I think when I am your age the world will have flying cars.

One of the things I like most about being a grandmother is enjoying the wide range of personalities that span all six grandkids.

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

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orest Hills Country Club (FHCC), a vibrant Club in the heart of Clarkson Valley, has been around for over 50 years. Regardless of membership or not, many may not be aware of the charitable impact this Club is making for those in need. FHCC has had a charitable foundation from its onset, but it was very small. Recently, under the leadership of Eric Verhulst, President of the Forest Hills Charitable Foundation, he and the Club felt the need to broaden their

scope of charitable giving to have a greater impact throughout our community and beyond.

Eric and his team, Tom Hartnagel, V.P. of the Foundation, Fred Salerno, Secretary, and committee members, Mike Flavin, Karen Vangyia, and Tom Dean put their heads together and came up with an amazing vision that became a reality this past January, the First Annual FHCC Charity Gala. The theme for the first Gala was "Meet me in St. Louis," based on the 1904 World's Fair. This event was a huge undertaking involving much coordination, and the team worried that it might not turn out as they envisioned. Due to exhaustive and passionate work of many people, the event raised \$72,000+ going to 21 different charities!

Member Fred Salerno of Clarkson Valley was instrumental in getting the word out to members about the First Annual Charitable Gala. He spent countless hours reaching out to people by phone to promote interest in attending the event. Members could choose a charity they are passionate about and "purchase" a table where they were able to invite other members, or nonmembers to represent the charity with them. With Mr. Salerno's hard work, 230+ people were in attendance! Each charity was encouraged to provide up to 3 auction items where 100% of the proceeds went directly to the charity. The amount of donations for the auction far exceeded all expectations, totaling 82 items, 12 of which were donated by FHCC. It is a joy to sit with Colleen. The stories she shares, the joy that emits from her when she talks




about her clients and team, and, of course, her amazing attitude about life is infectious.

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
