



return. Lent and Easter are in March. The Irish are happy - so much you don't need to be Irish to enjoy a little St. Patrick's Day celebration. For those not ready to go outside, the NCAA March Madness Basketball Tournament can fill the television set, starting March 15th. Again, you don't have to be a fan to join in the party. This year daylight savings time returns on March 12th. With all these seasonal changes, it's time to start planning those outdoor activities you longed to do this winter and perhaps some leftover from last year. Is it time to do that home addition perhaps a kitchen-redo or redecorating the main floor, etc? Make part of your plan to check with City Hall for what permits you need. We can explain what is needed, when, etc. once we have your plans.

March is our month of introduction to

spring, officially March 20th. It seems

to me, March's idea of spring is a warm

sun one day, then a cold, blowing wind

the next day. We get energized for more

outdoor activities while realizing there

are certain other matters to handle

this month, i.e. our favorite, it's time

to start or finish up your income tax

Back outside, the season of grass growing, planting of flowers, etc., is not far away. Nor is the arrival of unwelcome allergies and pests, i.e. mosquitoes. As you may know, the City contracts with St. Louis County Health Department/Vector Control for service. On a regular basis, the County larvicides certain bodies of standing water, lakes, gullies, etc. in our City - especially those areas where the water becomes stagnant and larvae can breed. Since West Nile Virus became established in the St.

Louis area, control of the adult population is by spraying. The decision for treatment is based on the threat it poses which is primarily derived from mosquito surveillance information as well as your calls to City Hall. Thus, your calls for spraying are not automatic triggers for adulticiding (spraying), but are important in the decision process. Annually, we receive a spreadsheet from Vector Control Services showing the areas that are checked and treated. So, if you are familiar with standing water on public land and/or easements and are wondering if those are routinely larvicide, call City Hall.

Spring and summer are times for garage sales, too. The City asks that you obtain a permit for your sale. It doesn't cost anything. The reasons for the permit – it's a safety issue: 1) we will provide you with NO PARKING signs to be placed on one side of the street; 2) the police need to know the time and date, so they can assist you with any problems. The ordinance covering garage sales is on our website for your review. Go to **www.** *clarksonvalley.org*, scroll down to the bottom, click on Sign Ordinance - it is Section 505.030.5 Garage Sales.

NOTE: When your dog (Fido) takes you for a walk - walk on the left side facing traffic!!







chicken Parmesan Baked Ziti From the Kitchen of Mandy Gregory & Sponsored by Just Around The Corner Floor

found this recipe for Chicken Parmesan Baked Ziti on Pinterest. It is super easy and a great "family meal" recipe. I either saute' and shred two chicken breasts or I have even used rotisserie chicken which makes it even easier. Feel free to change up the type of pasta, even using whole wheat if you like. But, you have to use the Delallo Pomodora FrescoTomato Basil sauce! I know people can poo-poo jar sauces, but we have made plenty of fresh and tasted plenty of jars and this jar sauce really tastes the closest to fresh to us. It is delish. Enjoy!

INGREDIENTS

- 12 ounces penne ziti (or any pasta shape)
- 2 cups shredded, cooked chicken (about 2small chicken breasts)
- 1 (25 ounce) jar Delallo Pomodora Fresco Tomato Basil sauce (pasta sauce)
- 11/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (I used 2% low fat)
- 1/3 cup freshly-grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup packed fresh basil leaves, roughly chopped

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. Cook the pasta al dente in a large stockpot of generously-salted boiling according to package instructions. Drain. Return pasta to the stoc kpot and add chicken and tomato sauce. Gently toss to combine until the pasta is evenly coated.
- 3. Pour half of the pasta into a greased 11x7-inch or 9x13-inch baking dish. Sprinkle evenly with 1 cup of mozzarella cheese, half of the Parmesan cheese and half of the basil. Layer the remaining half of the pasta evenly on top. Sprinkle evenly with the remaining 1/2 cup of mozzarella cheese.
- 4. Bake for 20-25 minutes until the cheese is melted and just barely starts to turn golden. Remove and sprinkle immediately with the remaining Parmesan cheese and fresh basil. Serve warm.





pruning 101

If you are looking to rejuvenate your garden with lush, hearty as it falls. Stop and call a professional if you need to prune trees plants, then get out your garden shears! the time is right

March is the ideal time to prune your summer-blooming deciduous trees and shrubs because it is after the harshest winter weather has passed but before the burst of spring leaves. A good rule of thumb is that if a plant blooms before May 1, then prune it after it blooms, but if a plant blooms after May 1, then prune it in late winter to early spring. The latter category of trees and shrubs should never be clipped in the fall because pruning stimulates new growth at the time they are entering their dormant cycle, and fall pruning leaves plants vulnerable as the temperature drops. Also, try to prune in dry conditions to reduce the risk of spreading potentially harmful microbes that thrive in moisture.

chop, chop! Using sharp, clean garden shears, begin by pruning off any dead, diseased or damaged branches. If there are two branches crossing over and rubbing one another, prune off the smaller branch. Always cut branches back to their point of attachment to the parent branch or at the branch collar, which is the area of raised bark at the base of a branch. Don't leave unsightly "stubs," as they invite disease and are an eyesore for the neighbors! As you continue pruning, it is best to follow the plant's natural shape. Use caution pruning heavy branches by removing one small section at a time

so that its weight does not cause damage - to you or the plant -




