t a recent City Council meeting, the subject of youth curfew came up. Yes, there is a County and a City ordinance that established such a curfew for minors. Our City ordinance is concurrent with the County. Let me quote a portion of our ordinance.

"It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of seventeen (17) years to loiter, idle, wander or stroll, or to drive or ride in an automobile, play in or upon the public streets, private streets open to the public, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other places within the City between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. of the following day, official County time, except on Fridays and Saturdays when the hours shall be 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m. of the following day, official County time; provided however, that the provisions of this Section do not apply to a minor accompanied by his/ her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his/her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor."

Further, it states it is unlawful for the parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of a minor to knowingly permit such activity.

October 28 is the next date for another Drug Take-Back date. City Councilman Jim Meyer has served on the Rockwood Drug-Free Coalition for many years and continues to lead our commitment to addressing the youth drug problem. So, gather all those no longer necessary drugs and bring them to City Hall. Our police will be there to receive and destroy them appropriately.

Another note about the Rockwood Drug Coalition - some four to five years ago, our City, along with several other cities, was experiencing a rash of teenage parties. Too many of these resulted in overcrowded homes with underage drinking and drug abuse. The Coalition was instrumental in persuading cities to address this problem with more appropriate legislation. Our current ordinance does that and we believe it has assisted in reducing/eliminating these types of parties.

clear, should a gathering become unruly, the police are authorized to abate the gathering. The person responsible for the gathering is responsible for the actions of the group. If that person is a minor, then the parents or guardian of that minor will be jointly liable.



"SWIMMERS ... TAKE YOUR MARK ... GO!"


For Clarkson Valley resident Abby Watson (21), this phrase has often been heard throughout her extensive swimming career.


the 400 medley relay. In 2017, she was the Atlantic 10 champion in the 200 medley relay and a part of the A-10 Women's Swimming All-Academic team.



From TRAGEDY To TRIUMPH **Rebuilding With A New Focus**

perspectives from the past

e are the Norman family of Forest Hills, Rob and Sharon, and sons Robbie (17) and James (14). June 16, 2013, was a day our family will never forget. On that day, Father's Day no less, our house was destroyed by fire. Although devastating, we truly believed that God had intervened numerous times that day to ensure it wasn't worse -- we were not home at the time of the fire (because of multiple delays with the tournament games); delays that in all my years of coaching I had never seen before. The dogs were in the garage (because of the gopher gas odors), but were unharmed from the fire, and most of our pictures and sentimental items were salvaged. This recognition and realization of what happened gave us a deeper perspective on what truly should be important -- God, the strength of family, and true friends...not "stuff."

We purchased the house in Forest Hills because we felt like it could be a perfect home for our children. There was plenty of yard space where the boys could play games, space to add a pool, plenty of

room for us to entertain our friends and family, and a great back driveway area for a basketball court. Both Rob and I really enjoy working in the yard, and we were looking forward to transforming it and adding our own special touch.

At the time of the fire, Robbie just completed sixth grade and was almost 13. James was 10 and had just finished fourth grade. It had rained quite a bit the night before so we were waiting to hear if Robbie's baseball tournament would be rained out. We passed the time by working in the yard. Moles were overtaking our front beds, so we went on a mission to eradicate them. Rob put some gopher gas into one tunnel, and we soon found out that the horrible smelling smoke had penetrated the foundation and into our basement. We plugged a fan into one of the electrical outlets in the back of the basement to push the smell out and put the dogs in the garage, thinking the gas couldn't be good for them. We then left for Robbie's game and, at some point, there was an electrical surge to the outlet which sparked the fire. Pool chemicals ended up causing a minor explosion inside the house.

The news was devastating but we tried to focus on the positives and keep our boys' lives as normal as possible as if nothing had


happened. We told them we were excited because it was going to be a "new adventure" for our family. However, we needed shelter. Our neighbors across the street, Pat and Michelle Dean, called us from out of town and insisted that we stay in their house while they were gone. It's been such a blessing to live in a neighborhood with such caring people. The next week the same thing happened with another family going on vacation (The Walsh's). And the last few days we stayed at Rob's sister and brother-in-law's house.

A relocation company kept turning up houses in the Parkway School District, which we were concerned would disrupt our boys' lives even more by changing school districts. Rob found a home for sale in Wynncrest subdivision and asked the seller if he would be willing to rent the home. As it turned out, the seller was James' former Cub Scout Leader and one of Rob's clients. His client was inspired and had empathy for our situation and ended up renting to us for a year. Again, another blessing! Each boy also had a best friend in the neighborhood, so they were gone for hours hanging out with their buddies.

On the day of the fire, the newspaper captured pictures of a fireman carrying out our large wedding picture, unharmed. Our friend and neighbor Mary Ellen Block and a group of others came in the next day and retrieved most of our other pictures and photo albums before they were too water damaged. They painstakingly dried them out. This must have taken hours to accomplish. Only two things that were lost that I really care about: just above where the fire started I had hung a reproduction of a Camille Pissarro painting that I had done for my parents for their 25th wedding anniversary. It was totally destroyed. We also have a collection of recordable ornaments where each year the boys would record their favorite memory of the Christmas season. We were only able to save about half of them. Hearing the boys' voices from years' past is precious.

The part that brings us to tears is how incredibly kind and giving our neighbors and people in general were. One of the amazing things was that some of the people that gave the most, weren't always who we expected. Again, a clarifying moment. The day after the fire there were 30-40 people at the house helping us search for items once the Fire Marshall gave us clearance. Gina Donlin came and took pictures of everything to help us remember items and made a list of contents lost. She did loads of laundry for us, washing sports uniforms and basic clothing to get us through the first few days until we could get our clothes back from the cleaning company. Each load had to be washed multiple times to get the smoke smell out.

Mike Lavanier and Calvin Kolkmeyer, who had installed our wood floors a few years before, showed up at 7:00 a.m. the day after the fire, with a huge trailer to store our belongings until they could be taken and cleaned. They just said, "We heard you had a fire and figured you could use the help." They stayed with us and worked the entire day. Mike also took an antique clock from my dad's side of the family and completely restored it for me. Families of Robbie's

teammates brought coolers of drinks and food and tents as well as a basket of necessities. Rob had coached their kids for years and it seemed like they realized all that he had given to them, and they wanted to give back, which was incredibly touching.

Mary Beth Mazzola led a collection of gifts and gift cards from neighbors and families from school, which got us through the early weeks. It seemed like each group we belonged to also reached out with gifts and gift cards. Each of our employers and co-workers, the cub scout group, both boys' baseball teams and Rob's high school friends group donated.

The restoration company couldn't take jewelry, so a few ladies came and cleaned everything for me. I also remember Tammy Kirtser searching through insulation for what seemed like hours to find the journals that we kept for each of the boys capturing moments we wanted to remember from their childhood. When she found them, she took them home and dried each page to protect the writing. I've almost completed the transfer into a new journal for each!

We were starting to realize that we had a ton of stuff that was not important to us. We knew that God had a plan for us. He was reshaping the way we used to see things, the way we think. And we were willing to faithfully follow these changes in us, and wherever his plan was going to lead us.

When we moved into the house in Wynncrest we tried to make it home as much as possible -- we received a list of all the contents rescued from the house and moved as much as we could to our rental to make it feel more like home - this helped keep things "more normal" for all of us. Some of the items were the boy's artwork, pictures, our Christmas dishes and some of the other holiday decorations that were salvaged.



Since the fire, we are doing great! It's really hard to believe it's been more than four years since it happened. We love our new house because it incorporates all the improvement ideas we accumulated during the 11 years we lived at our house before the fire. Things like a bathroom off the garage, and laundry near the bedrooms, an exercise room, and a pool closet right off the pool. We approach buying things and accumulating stuff cautiously - we try to only purchase things we need. We've got a clean and organized garage, and back of the basement - and we want to keep it that way!

The fire brought clarity to what is really important to us: real and true friendship, a strong family, faith in God, and the goodness in others. We're thankful for the changes that took place in us. And, we truly thank all of those who were there to help us during that difficult time and the lessons they helped us to receive.

We loved the way it turned out but, suddenly, we had a two-story great room and really did not know how to work with this new space. While we did much of the overall design on our own, we needed help with the decorating. Then we met interior designer Meredith Wannamaker through Forest Hills Country Club, as she is one of the club's interior designers.

e are Jay and Amy Setnicka, and we moved to Clarkson Valley with our sons, Johny and Joey, 14 years

ago from Atlanta, GA. We fell in love with Clarkson

Valley and the Forest Hills neighborhood due to the quiet streets,

She knew immediately how to design the two-story great room. We had the bones of a grand living space, but it was lacking architectural detail. To maximize natural light and exterior views, we turned the doors that flank the hearth into windows and added two more similarly sized windows above. The hearth needed to "wow" as it is the main focal point of the room. We selected a multicolored, natural stone for texture and extended it to the ceiling to









draw the eye upward. The hearth seat was built-out to the full width of the room to balance the vertical height and anchor the wall visually. To fill the volume of space, we selected a large scale, wood, and metal chandelier to complement the stone. A wide crown molding was applied two-thirds up the wall to create a visual pause and balance the scale of the room. Lastly, we applied a medium-tone paint color below the crown molding and lighter paint above for contrast and to break up the volume of the space.

We love our space and will be using Meredith as we work on future spaces!
