

DOICALL? WHO DOICALL?


There's a situation – my neighbor leaves their trash can at the curb for days after pickup day. Not a lifethreatening case, but there must be a law (or something) against it. Not a big deal, but? The city does have an ordinance – it's a violation. Let's set the stage to go further in our discussion.

History tells us for people to live in a peaceful, harmonious community a set of rules (laws) is necessary. In the good ol' U.S. of A., we start with our constitution, establishing rule of law – not rule by law as is the case in Dictatorships (communism). So, the rules we chose to live by at the various levels of government, federal, state, and city, are legislated into law. What does this have to do with this article's title? Just a reminder that city ordinances (including ours) are in place based on the citizen's (you) desired everyday living condition in the community. So, what happens when you observe what appears to be an ordinance violation? If it's a close neighbor problem and you feel comfortable talking to your neighbor, great! Do so! It's always the

best thing to do. If this is not an option and the situation cannot be resolved, call City Hall or email. We will investigate and determine the appropriate action. Obviously, if the situation involves safety or violence, call 911.

Police - Obviously, call 911 for any emergency situation; other calls to police should include activity in progress or just happened, i.e., strange cars roaming or parked on your street or in your neighborhood. Many of you are doing so - good! Other reported disruptions in the neighborhood are noise, congested streets, etc. The police are always available and appreciate your assistance in all these matters. Anytime you are in communication with the police, and it was exceptionally good or poorly handled, please let me know. As we have enjoyed excellent police protection, let's have it continue.

City Hall - Back to contacting City
Hall. What about the specific case we
started with, where your neighbor is
leaving their trash cart out at the curb
for days after pickup? And then leaving
it out in the open after removing it from
the curb. Or, what about some other
violation, i.e., loud music into the late
night? As we discussed earlier, if you



choose not to talk to your neighbor about it, but you think their actions are wrong, and they are in this case, call City Hall or email – be prepared to clearly explain the situation. We will investigate and determine what action, if any, is appropriate. You do not have to be identified.



What factors should students consider in choosing the right college fit for them?



When can you choose retirement?

If you're like most people, your work has been a central part of your life. So, wouldn't it be nice to have the flexibility to decide when you no longer want to work?

Many people of retirement age have achieved this type of control. In fact, two-thirds of workers ages 65 and older say they work primarily because they want to, not because they have to, according to a 2021 study by Edward Jones and Age Wave. But that means that one-third of workers in this age group feel financially compelled to work. This doesn't necessarily mean they dislike the work they do — but it's probably fair to say they would have liked the option of *not* working. How can you give yourself this choice?


You can start by asking yourself these questions:

- When do I want to retire? You'll want to identify the age at which you wish to retire. You may change your mind later and move this date up or back, but it's a good idea to have a target in mind.
- What sort of retirement lifestyle do I want? When you retire, do you anticipate staying close to home and pursuing your hobbies, or do you hope to travel the world? Would you like to spend your time volunteering? Open your own business or do some consulting? Clearly, some of these choices will require more resources than others, so you'll want to follow a financial strategy that aligns with the retirement lifestyle you intend to pursue.
- Am I saving and investing enough? As you chart your course toward your retirement journey, you'll want to assess the sources of income you'll have available. If you think you may be falling short of achieving your retirement goals, you may need to consider saving more.
- When should I start taking Social Security? You can begin collecting Social Security benefits as early as 62, but your monthly payments will be much bigger if you wait until your "full" retirement age, which will likely be between 66 and 67. Your decision about when to take Social Security will depend on several factors, including your other sources of income and your family history of longevity. Of course, as you're probably aware, the Social Security system is facing significant financial stress, so it's possible that we may see changes to Social Security based on actions Congress could take. In any case, you might want to be fairly conservative in estimating how much Social Security can contribute to your retirement income.



By addressing the above questions, you can get a clearer sense of when you might reach the point at which work is optional. But you'll also need to consider other factors, too, such as how much you enjoy working or when your spouse or partner is planning to retire. In any case, the sooner you start planning for this next phase of your life, the better position you'll be in when it's time to make the transition.

RICKY BOLAÑOS & HIS ABUELO, YALI MOLINA

Questions Ricky asked his Abuelo, Yali:

When you were my age, what did you want to be when you grew up?

At your age, I really liked science. I had a lot of chemistry kits and would enjoy mixing different liquids. I wanted to be a chemist. In my senior year of high school, after attending a few spiritual retreats, I had a spark of interest in becoming a priest. Nevertheless, it did not progress to anything more. That same year I also realized my gift for public speaking and legal reasoning. I decided to pursue a law degree.

What's one way the world was different when you were my age?

The world was completely different. To start, we did not have TV, cell phones, or electronic games of any type. We would make up our own games like cops and robbers or "cowboys and indians." We would also go skating, fly a kite, and ride our bikes. Basically, our main source of entertainment was being outside and playing with our friends in the town. I grew up in a small town where everyone knew each other. It was a life full of imagination. Kids nowadays play more with their electronics than actually playing outside and interacting with other children.

What makes you happy?

A hug or a kind gesture, especially from my grandchildren.

What's your favorite memory of your own grandfather or grandmother?

My maternal grandmother is the one I was closest to. She was a tall, beautiful woman. She walked







around with a cane because she had broken her femur, and they had replaced it with one made out of platinum. I remember so many great things about her. My fondest memory of her is when we used to play poker. One time I beat her with a straight flush. When I would try to collect my winnings, she would say, "Oh, sweetheart, you are not going to make your grandmother pay, right?" She never did pay me.

What were you scared of when you were little, and when did you stop being afraid?

I heard a lot of scary folktales when I was younger. I also remember that in my house, there was a "green room" where a priest would stay. After he passed away, I would be terrified of going into his room because I always thought his spirit was there. I would always be scared of spirits. However, I was also a very curious boy and would sometimes venture out to the cemetery during funerals. Then I would get scared because I felt that the spirits would follow me home since I still had some cemetery soil on the soles of my shoes. I somehow stopped being afraid when I was about 9 years old in boarding school; I guess I didn't have any other choice.

Can you tell me about the first time we ever met?

It was a very special day. Since I live far away, I got to meet you a few days after you were born. I was anxiously waiting to see you and carry you. It felt like something magical happened between us; it was love at first sight. You were my first grandson! I still get this same feeling every time we reunite.

How did you meet my grandmother?

We basically met when we were children; we grew up in the same town. She did not like me very much because she thought I was cocky. 





You must take ACTION

Disruption can make or break us. The shift from summer to fall comes with a dozen moving pieces and can be paralyzing if we are not prepared. No one wants to experience sewer backups in the home.

Like many questions around home maintenance, when it comes to sewer problems, prevention is the best solution. Considering how much damage can be caused by water in your basement, it makes sense to spend a little time testing out your drainage system and addressing any problems before a catastrophe occurs. Also, make sure you have an endorsement in your homeowner's insurance called "Back Up of Sewer or Drains."

The endorsement of BACK UP OF SEWER OR DRAINS covers losses caused by water that backs up from sewer or drains, including sump pumps, sump pump wells and any system that removes surface water as well as broken pipes. It is important to mention that FLOOD will not be covered by your homeowner's policy unless you have an additional flood policy written by FEMA. A flood is basically when outside water enters your house through walls, windows or through underneath doors.

If you have the endorsement of the Sewer Back Up and water comes out from the drains and floods your house, your personal property and repairs will be covered up to the limit specified in the policy. Please review your Homeowners Insurance policy with your Agent to make sure you are protected.

Here are a few easy ways to keep your basement clean and dry:

Make sure your drainage system works.

Often, water in your home comes down to preventable drainage problems. A few hours of work could keep the water out. Review this checklist to help:

- Your home's gutter downspouts should extend at least 10 feet away from the foundation of the house so water is carried away from basement walls.
- Clear your gutters at least twice a year to prevent them from overflowing. Leaves and debris will clog gutters and can send water back toward your roof, walls, or foundation.
- Gutters and downspouts should not be connected to municipal sewage lines.
- Your yard should be graded to slope away from the house, so surface water is drained away.
- If your gutters connect to storm sewers, keep drain lines clear.

Prevent backflow.

Backflow is the reversal of water in any plumbing system. It can lead to undesirable leaking and flooding. Some homes are equipped with check valve devices that allow water and sewage to flow away from the drain, preventing water and sewage from backing up into the drain. Gatevalve devices operate like a gate, closing and shutting off the flow of water and sewage.

Drain plugs and standpipes can also be used to prevent backflow. Both are relatively inexpensive solutions but also come with their own risks. Drain plugs seal off the flow of water but can cause an overflow to occur at the next opening in the system. Standpipes, or vertical pipes connected and sealed to a drain, can contain minor overflows and act as safety valves but can only contain backflow up to their height, usually just three feet. If you think you're having problems with backflow, contact a plumber or contractor immediately.

Sump pumps.

Sump Pumps are pumps that remove water from a reservoir in your home. There are several types of sump pumps, including single sump pumps and dual-level systems, which employ a backup pump. Usually, batteries or a generator can be used to power the pump in case of a power failure. If you'd like to get a sump pump for your home, check with your local plumbing contractor or building code official for additional requirements.

When all else fails...

Sometimes water still gets in even when you take precautions. If it does, here are a few things you can do to minimize damage:

• Keep items stored in the basement area shelved or off the floor. Consider replacing cardboard boxes with sturdy containers for storage. Place furniture on casters or shims and arranged away from floor drains.

Check with your local building code department, water utility or qualified plumber for more information on steps you can take to reduce the chance of water damage to your home. And talk to your insurance agent to see what's covered in your homeowner's policy.

Flood insurance - Do I need it?

Most homeowners' insurance policies do not cover damage caused by flooding. This is important to check when getting flood insurance quotes.

Federal flood insurance coverage.

Most flood insurance is written through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), which is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). A flood insurance policy normally takes 30 days from the date of purchase to go into effect. So don't wait until a flood is imminent to buy a policy. The National Flood Insurance Program is only available in the United States.

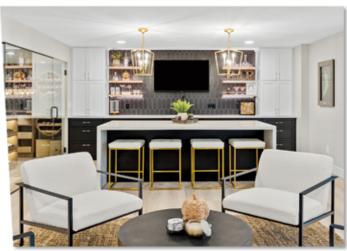
